OUR OUTREACH TEAM WORKS TO BRIDGE THAT GAP SO THAT EVERYONE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS IN CLARK COUNTY HAS ACCESS TO A VARIETY OF SERVICES THAT CAN BETTER THEIR SITUATION. DURING 2023, DUE TO THE GROWING NUMBER OF PEOPLE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS, THE PROGRAM GREW FROM A TEAM OF NINE TO A TEAM OF 15 WHO SERVED 544 PEOPLE AND AIDED 191 IN BECOMING PERMANENTLY HOUSED IN 2023.
